On the motion of Councilman Chinnis, seconded by Councilman Hearn, County Council voted six in favor, with one abstention (Bailey), to give 2nd Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Dorchester County Business License Ordinance Number 17-15, as Previously Amended, with Respect to Section 2: "Definitions," Subsection D - to Amend the Definition of Gross Income; Section 6: "Deductions, Exemptions, and Charitable Organizations," Subsections C and D - to Add an Exception for Gross Income for Manufacturers of Goods or Materials; and Section 22: "Rate & Classification," - to Add Five Tiers to the Declining Rate Schedule for Businesses Reporting Gross Income in Excess of \$5,000,000.

EAGLE CREEK/ CHANDLER CREEKS FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE FROM THE US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS
