Chairman Feltner called the meeting to order and Councilman Rosebrock gave the Invocation.

MOTION TO AMEND THE AGENDA

1. On the motion of Mr. Hargett, seconded by Mr. Rosebrock, Council voted six in favor, and one absent, to amend the agenda to add two additional items for discussions, with those items being a Rezoning Request for Mr. Joseph Myers, Jr. and "Senate Bill 1270".

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REQUEST TO ADDRESS COUNCIL

There were no cards received, requesting to address Council.

1ST READING FOR REZONING REQUEST FOR JOSEPH H. MYERS, JR.

2. On the motion of Mr. Rosebrock, seconded by Mr. Hargett, Council voted six in favor, and one absent, to give 1st Reading to a Rezoning Request from Mr. Joseph Myers, TMS #136-09-00-012, and to place this request in the Planning Development and Building Committee for further consideration.

Councilman Murphy was absent.

SENATE BILL 1270

Councilman Hargett reported that *Senate Bill 1270* passed by the Senate and was now going back to the House of Representatives, and Senator Mike Rose requested for Council's support, by sending a Chairman's Letter to Dorchester County House Members requesting their support of this Senate Bill. In addition, Councilman Hargett reported that our County Treasurer and Auditor spoke to Senator Rose about this issue that was ongoing in Dorchester County and had asked the County Auditor to appear before Council to discuss the matter. Mr. Messervy, County Auditor, addressed Council to explain why Council should support this Bill. Mr. Messervy stated Senate *Bill 1270* repeals the requirement that property tax refunds be given for the current tax year, plus two years retroactively. He stated that currently, Dorchester County, Dorchester School District Two, Dorchester School District Four, the municipalities within the County, and Dorchester County fire departments spend thousands of current year tax dollars to pay refunds for prior tax years, and this results in tax revenue shortfalls for these entities, which in turn affects service delivery to the citizens. After discussion by Council, the following motion was made:

3. On the motion of Mr. Hargett, seconded, by Mr. Rosebrock, Council voted six in favor, and one absent, to send a Chairman's Letter to the Dorchester County Delegation House Members and request their support of *Senate Bill 1270*.

MRS. TAMMI O. BYRD, RDH, CEO/CLINICAL DIRECTOR OF HEALTH PROMOTION SPECIALISTS, PRESENTATION OF SCHOOL BASED DENTAL PREVENTION PROGRAM

Mrs. Tammi O. Byrd, the CEO and Clinical Director of Health Promotions Specialists thanked Council for allowing her to address them. She presented Council with her program that allows Dorchester County Schools the opportunity to partner with the State Dental Program that is proven to improve oral health. The Dorchester County School Districts have the opportunity to partner with this school based dental sealant program at no cost to the School Districts. Dr. Garris requested Council to rescind its support of the program.

County Administrator, Mr. Jason Ward, clarified that the County's participation amount of \$4.5 million of funding for the proposed Nursing, Science, and Math Building would be contingent upon Charleston and Berkeley Counties' participation in the project. Council agreed with the Administrator's clarification.

His main concern was the area where he resides on Breeze Way Road located near Zion Road in Dorchester. In addition, he stated his opposition to any proposed industrial development in the area and provided Council with a letter from his neighbors.
- Mrs. Cherylee Bowerbank addressed Council and requested a change to the Dorchester County Ordinance #04-13, regarding changing the zoning in the County zoned AC (Absence of Control).
 In addition, she stated her opposition to any proposed industrial development in the residential area where she lived, and this was her reason for her request in changing the Zoning Ordinance.

Chairman Feltner called the meeting to order and Councilman Hargett gave the Invocation.

There were no requests to address Council.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 7, 2010, COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

1. On the motion of Mr. Hargett, seconded by Mr. Davis, Council voted six in favor, and one absent, to adopt the Minutes from the June 7, 2010, County Council Meeting.

Councilman Murphy was absent.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE 2010 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT AWARD

Chairman Feltner opened the Public Hearing to receive public comments on the County's application for the 2010 Justice Assistance Grant Award, and he reported that the application for \$43,683 was sent to County Council in May for its review. He stated the County was eligible to receive the funds and the Sheriff's Office would use the grant funds to purchase radios, computer equipment, weaponry, gear, and supplies. Chairman Feltner opened the floor to the public for comment. Upon hearing no public comments, the Public Hearing was closed.

3RD READING FOR "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING RESISTING A LAWFUL ARREST AND REQUIRING COMPLIANCE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S COMMANDS"

2. On the motion of Mr. Hargett, seconded by Mr. Rosebrock, Council voted six in favor, and one absent, to give 3rd Reading to Ordinance #10-12, "An Ordinance Prohibiting Resisting a Lawful Arrest and Requiring Compliance with a Law Enforcement Officer's Commands".

If adopted this ordinance would create consolidated review committees, which would have the power to approve development permits in developments within master planned overlay area form districts (10,000 acres or more).

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GUESTS

MR. RUSS HIGHTOWER AND MR. BOB PEELER, WASTE MANAGEMENT — CHECK PRESENTATION

Chairman Feltner welcomed Mr. Hightower and Mr. Peeler, and thanked them on behalf of Dorchester County Council. He stated that this was a major event for the County to receive a check specifically for "Road Infrastructure Improvements". Mr. Hightower and Mr. Peeler addressed Council on behalf of Waste Management Industries and presented a check for \$180,000, which was the largest and the first of two installments. Mr. Peeler said the funds were for "Road Infrastructure Improvements", to help improve the intersection of US Highway 78 and SC Hwy 27, to provide acceleration, deceleration, and turn lanes to the landfill in Dorchester, South Carolina. Council thanked Mr. Hightower and Mr. Peeler for this wonderful donation from Waste Management to improve roads. In addition, Council stated that Waste Management Industries has committed to keeping the highways clean along the road going to the landfill.

MR. TRIPP MULDROW, PRESENTATION DORCHESTER COUNTY MARKET STUDY RESULTS AND STRATEGY RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Tripp Muldrow, Project Manager with Arnett Muldrow & Associates, Ltd., who was hired by Dorchester County Economic Development to complete a retail market study for the County, came before Council to provide the study results and strategy recommendations of the "Market Study and Branding Plan for Dorchester County". Mr. Muldrow stated the study represented a unique partnership between the County, the Towns of Summerville and St. George, both Chambers of Commerce, and Summerville DREAM to examine retail trade patterns in the County, evaluate opportunities for retaining and recruiting businesses, and develop a market strategy to retain and recruit customers.

Mr. Muldrow reported the highlights of the data collected, presented the study's findings, and made recommendations to County Council to adopt the study's "Strategy and Recommendations" and was available to receive and answer questions from Council. Council thanked Mr. Muldrow for his time and hard work. The study's findings and recommendations are broken down as follows:

- The market study report found significant retail "leakage" in both the Summerville and St. George communities and in the County as a whole. Retail leakage occurs when consumers within a defined geography spend more on retail goods than store sales within that same geography. The consumers, in turn, must turn to alternate locations for their consumer expenditures. In fact, retail leakage for Dorchester County as a whole totals \$656 million dollars each year.
- Dorchester County is not likely to recoup all of the lost sales within the County because of the concentration of retail within Summerville in Berkeley County and the impact of being close to a retail sales center as strong as Charleston County.
- However, the sheer size of the retail leakage represents a significant opportunity for Dorchester County and its communities to capture significant increases in sales. This is particularly true because the County continues to see population growth and this data is but a snapshot in time.

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GUESTS STUDY RESULTS AND STRATEGY RECOMMENDATIONS- CONTINUED

Mr. Muldrow stated that with keeping the three-listed finding (page four) in mind, his firm recommended Dorchester County and its communities pursue a series of recommendations revolving around four key strategies:

o A Marketing Strategy to recruit and retain customers for existing retailers.

o A Planning and Development Strategy that allows for future retail growth both within incorporated and unincorporated areas of Dorchester County.

o A Recruitment and Retention Strategy that indicates the types of retail that is most likely to see success in the Dorchester County market and in both St. George's and Summerville's submarkets.

o An Organizational Strategy that helps all of the partners in the study understand roles and responsibilities to see the successful implementation of the plan.

- The Marketing Strategy includes a series of brand identity designs for each community and partner organizations, including Dorchester County. The consulting team worked with County Staff on applications of the new County Seal and a consistent font and word type for the County to use in a variety of applications. Arnett Muldrow also recommended a strategy to promote the unincorporated and small towns of the County. Similar recommendations were made for St. George and Summerville.
- The Planning and Development Strategy recommendations affirm the findings of the Dorchester County Comprehensive Plan with regard to creating nodes for future commercial development at key crossroads and locations throughout the County. The plan recommended that Dorchester County take a pro-active approach for retail development in these nodes because retail development is likely to cluster along interstate interchanges outside of the County in the absence of a positive planning strategy for these areas.
- The Recruitment and Retention Strategy recommends that the County explore a series of incentives for retail development including a small matching grant program for existing businesses and the pursuit of "Tax Increment Financing" to help finance public infrastructure costs for developments in key areas. These incentives are designed as a short-term investment to stimulate retail development. Ultimately, the goal is for Dorchester County to have a healthy balance of commercial development within the County itself to serve the growing population base. Of course, the investment will be recouped in future property, sales, and local option tax revenues.
- The Organizational Strategy recommends developing a program within Dorchester County Economic Development focused on retail recruitment and retention alongside specific recommendations for St. George and Summerville.

DORCHESTER COUNTY MARKET STUDY RESULTS AND STRATEGY RECOMMENDATIONS

7. On the motion of Mr. Rosebrock, seconded by Mr. Davis, Council voted unanimously to adopt the Strategies and Recommendations made by Mr. Tripp Muldrow, Project Manager with Arnett Muldrow & Associates, Ltd., for Dorchester County.

MRS. TERRY SEABROOK, PARTNERSHIP SPECIALIST US CENSUS 2010, "UPDATE/POSITIVE HIGHLIGHTS" 2010 CENSUS

Ms. Terry Seabrook, Partnership Specialist with the US Census 2010, appeared before County Council and gave an "Update and Positive Highlights" from the 2010 Census for Dorchester County and the State of South Carolina. She stated that according to figures South Carolina, ranked 49th in the 2000 Census in terms of mail back participation, moved all the way up to 23rd out of 50 States. In addition, she reported that Dorchester County went from a 69% response rate in 2000 to a 76% response rate in 2010. Ms. Seabrook called the 7% response rate "significant". She also complemented and thanked the Dorchester County Staff, specifically Mr. Jason Ward, Mr. Clay Pendarvis, Mr. David Garber, and Mr. Harold LeaMond, that worked on the 2010 Census. Ms Seabrook told Council what a fabulous job the county employees working with the Census performed and how much she appreciated Mr. Jason Ward's continuous support. She reported that the "Non-response Follow-ups", were completed for the Census throughout South Carolina, but that she and the teams were still out in the communities letting people know there was still time to be counted, and the teams were still doing quality control work. Ms. Seabrook thanked Council for all of their help and support, and received, and answered questions from Council. Council thanked Ms. Seabrook for a job well done.
