CHAIRMAN'S TIME

Chairman Byars asked that everyone continue to pray for Councilman Davis and his wife Joyce. Councilman Davis is still in the hospital at MUSC. Chairman Byars said we need his leadership, we love and miss him and look forward to having him back with us soon.

REQUESTS TO ADDRESS COUNCIL

- Ms. Stephanie Thorpe, 126 Kristen Lane, Reevesville, she created a recreation coalition in upper Dorchester County and represents a large group of people. She wants to make sure their voices are heard. She supports the vote as it sat for libraries and parks. She said the parks and recreation referendum should move forward as it was voted on by the people. She doesn't believe it should be a separate vote. She would like for the vote to move forward for her children, other children and families.
- Ms. Amanda Horton, 186 Taylor Pond Road, Dorchester, she is frustrated that the referendum is held up by a lawsuit. She believes the lawsuit is causing children to miss out on something they could benefit from. She said the facilities they have now are overcrowded. She said there are 400 children signed up between baseball and softball. She said if there were more parks and fields they could get their children home at a decent hour. She requested that County Council pass a Resolution requesting the Plaintiff's immediately drop their appeal to the South Carolina Supreme Court so the children of Dorchester County can have access to the opportunities they deserve.

COUNCIL MEMBER'S TIME - MR. GEORGE BAILEY

Councilman Bailey thanked Stephanie Thorpe and Amanda Thorton for speaking up. He said he has worked as hard as he could to get the land for the Courthouse Park and Ashley River Park. He said he has done everything he can to move the lawsuit.

Chairman Byars said the Courthouse Park is fully designed, permitted and ready to go once the lawsuit is resolved. He said they are working on a USDA Grant to build a pavilion at the Courthouse Park.

Mr. Jason Ward said we received a grant of \$125,000 for the Courthouse Park. Mr. Ward said there was 3 acres of wetlands when the property was originally purchased and the plans have since changed because of wetlands. Mr. Ward said we are looking forward to moving forward.

COUNCIL MEMBER'S TIME – MR. DAVID CHINNIS

Councilman Chinnis said Attorney General Alan Wilson was at Summerville Coffee Roasters for the Summerville Republican Women's Club Meeting and said to everyone there that what he wrote was an opinion and only an opinion and would require adjudication. He said from his standpoint he believes it was adjudicated not once but twice. Councilman Chinnis said his opinion is the suit should be dropped. He said 30 days after the suit is dropped the bonds can be sold.
